A trial of [PressDisplay](#) is now available. This service gives you access to over 2,200 newspapers from around the world, including 97 countries newspapers available in 57 different languages. The newspapers are available online often before they are printed. You will be able to keep up-to-date and find material relevant to a wide range of subjects easily through this service.

Monograph purchasing

The Library is processing all rush orders promptly to meet your requirements. Because of the falling Australian dollar and budget pressures from increased serial prices, regular monograph orders are being paused until mid October.

Southeast Asian Serials Index

The Southeast Asian Serials Index (SASI) was developed in the days before extensive online journals as a means of providing access to the contents of some Indonesian language journals. Currently, 34 journals have reasonably current index data available through SASI. Most of those journals are available in full text through Proquest, JSTOR, or other online sources, and

SuperSearch. We are considering the future of SASI, particularly as average use per day
